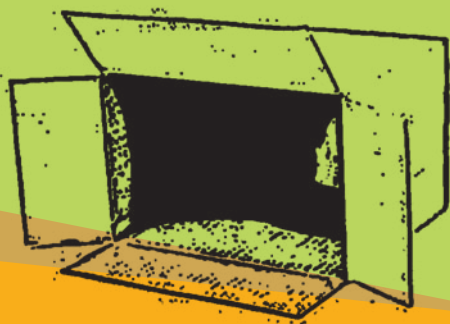

#### HALESWORTH LIBRARY

INK, in association with Halesworth Library, is offering poetry writing workshops in two local primary schools, Edgar Sewter and St Peter's, Holton. Led by local writer and Halesworth Library Information Advisor, Francesca Armour-Chélu. Pupils will be encouraged to be creative and to write poems which reflect their own understanding of *Rising Waters*. Their finished work will be on display in the Library during the Festival.

*The David Kemp Talk: Back to the Future*

David Kemp is the Environment Agency's Coastal Team Leader for the entire shoreline from Hunstanton to Purfleet. David is charged with forecasting and responding to the next tidal surge. In a presentation and Q&A that includes illustrations, David gives a practitioner's insight into the huge forces threatening our coast.
